

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OUR STORIES IN LIVING HISTORY: TEME VALLEY SOUTH

Hanley William: Hanley Dingle waterfalls, woodland and pool.

LENGTH: 3 miles

1. Leave the churchyard by the back metal gates.

Turn left and go through the farm gate. Continue ahead to the stile to the left of the barns. Continue over a further stile to Hanley Court.



2. Bear right to follow the bridleway, which is signposted.

After passing the Court, take the stile on the left not the metal gate in front of you. Bear left to go into the next field and follow the line of the fence down to the edge of the wood. On reaching the wood, turn left (don't take the gate into the wood that faces you) and continue to a gate and stile.



3. The gate and stile are above a waterfall into the dingle.

Return back to the gate to continue the walk. Go through the gate and continue downwards into the dingle. The path crosses an embankment and bridge spanning the dingle. Shortly afterwards the path bears left. Ignore the path to the right. Enjoy the woodland and sound of water running over the fall.

4. Continue on along the top of the dingle.

You will see signs for footpaths that cut across, but ignore these and continue straight ahead. You will eventually reach buildings connected to 'Brick Barns'. Take the stile to the right. Follow the path to a drive where you turn right (don't turn left into Grovewood)



5. Continue along this track.

Shortly after a house on your left there is a metal footpath gate on your right. Take into the garden area and leave by the similar gate in front of you. Go diagonally across the field to the gate in the boundary to your left. Head for the telegraph pole near the edge of the wood and go through the gate to continue on the path. Shortly on your right you will see a gate that leads to the other side of the valley. Go through the gate. Collier's pool and waterfall is now beneath you.



6. Continue up the hill and back to Hanley Court.

Either retrace your steps on the footpath you set out on or continue down the drive to the Lodge. Here turn left on the road and continue back to Hanley William Church.
