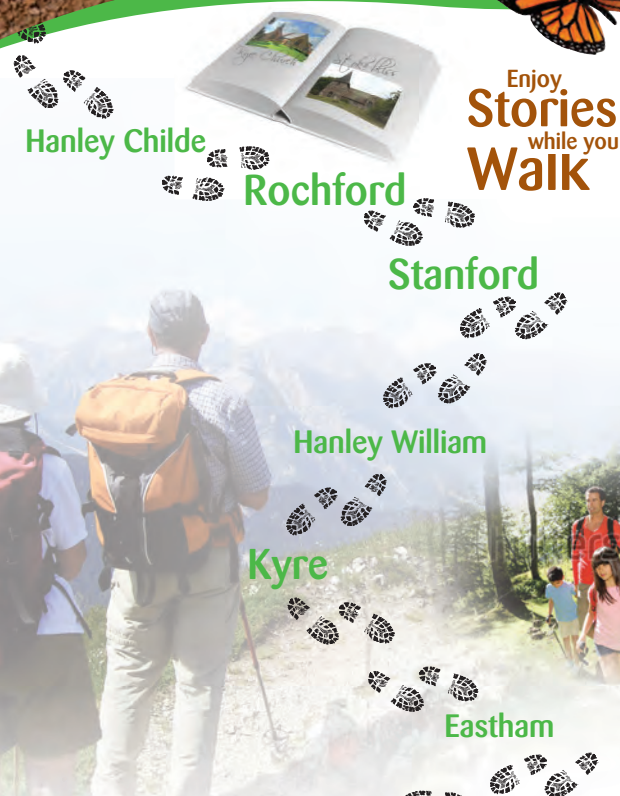

## Stoke Bliss: farmland, ridge views towards Clee hill and Wolferlow.

LENGTH: 5.6 miles

### 1. From the entrance door to the church, turn left to walk through the churchyard and out of the metal gate.

When you meet the road, turn left and walk along the road. Follow the public bridleway signposted on the left. When paths meet, bear right to follow the bridleway.

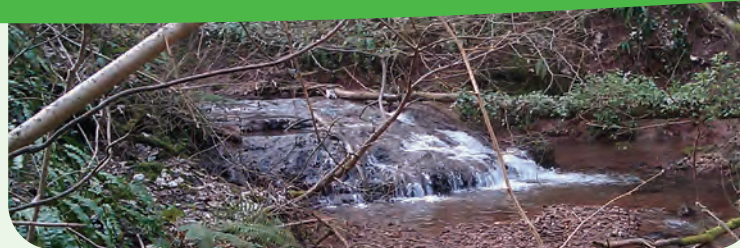


### 2. Cross the field, keeping the boundary on your right.

Go through a wooden gate and cross another field. Continue straight ahead to cross another field. Go through the wooden gate and carry on. Go through a metal gate and continue walking, keeping the field boundary on your right.

### 3. Go through the wooden gate on the right.

Go through another wooden gate to meet the road. (Alternative route to avoid stiles and thick woodland: Follow the road up the hill to a bridle path sign on your right. Follow the instructions from \* below) Turn left to follow the bridleway. Go through the wooden gate on the right. Turn left. Cross the field, keeping the boundary on your left. Cross the wooden bridge.



### 4. Go through the wooden gate.

Take the stile straight ahead of you and head up the hill. Bear right and take the stile. Continue and take the stile on the right into the wooded area. Walk to the top of the incline, bearing right, until you reach the road. Turn left and continue along the road. Turn right to follow the signposted bridleway.\* Go through the wooden gate and carry on. Go through another wooden gate. Enjoy the views across the valley on your right.

### 5. Take the wooden gate and continue.

Take the metal gate. Just before you reach Cockshutts farm, bear left (there is a post with a footpath sign on top to indicate this route). Go through the wooden gate. At the farm track, turn left. At the post with the white 'permissive route' footpath sign, turn right. Carry on across several fields (which are sometimes used for horse events), until you reach the road.



### 6. Cross the road, and take the stile to continue on the footpath.

Bear left to head towards the church. Take the gate into the churchyard and walk around to the main entrance. Exit the churchyard using the main gate. Turn right and right again to follow the footpath in front of Church Cottage. At the end of the field take the stile into the Christmas tree plantation.



### 7. Carry on straight ahead and take the metal gate.

Turn left past Wooflerlow House and Brambley Edge turn right onto the path. After a metal gate, bear left to a wooden gate. Follow the bridleway to a farm. Turn right at the farm following the farm track. On leaving the farm ignore the track to your left. At the next farm, Upper Underley, follow the track right and left through the farm.



### 8. Cross over the road and go through the metal gate opposite you.

Cross the field and walk through the gateposts. Bear left and take the wooden gate in the field boundary on your left. Go through the metal gate on your right. Follow the bridleway through the gates. Cross the field dropping down to the water and up the other side to meet the road. Turn left to the church.
