Winter's Ouiet Work

As December settles over the Teme Valley, we could be forgiven for seeing only cold and greyness. The fields rest, the hedgerows stand bare, and the hills seem to draw in close. It's easy to long for lighter days — or to take comfort in the glow of Christmas lights and carols that make winter feel gentler than it is.



What is frost – folklore and cold hard facts

The beginning of December brings frost, perhaps best described by Shakespeare in *The Merchant of Venice*: "Cold indeed, and labor lost: then farewell heat, and welcome frost!"

What created frost was clouded in folklore long ago. In ancient times there was a rather romantic idea that frost fell from the moon and stars on cloudless nights. And in Norse mythology a character appeared who cast frost – his name was Jokul Frosti, literally Icicle Frost, or Frost Giant – while in Germany Frau Holle shook a winter blanket over the ground with a covering or frost.

Eventually our familiar Jack Frost appeared in England, although apparently his name had nothing to do with Jokul Frosti. Jack Frost was a mischievous, impish character who worked his frosty magic at night and was first featured in 1734 in a book called *Round about our Coal Fire, or Christmas Entertainments*. Jack Frost also became something of a versatile figure who went round in autumn with a paintbrush colouring leaves red, yellow, brown and orange.

As for the nitty-gritty science of what created frost, there was an idea in the 1780s that both frost and dew came when the ground was a few degrees colder than the air above, although it was thought that the cold was caused by the dew and frost, not the other way round.

In 1812 a breakthrough in understanding frost was made by William Wells, an American-born

doctor working in London. He found that on calm, cold nights the ground rapidly cooled down, radiating its heat into space, and that rapidly cooled the air close to the ground until the moisture in the air turned to frost when the surface reached below freezing.

For the chocolate and orange

50g/1¾oz chocolate (milk or dark), chopped ½ orange, grated zest only (or your choice of fruit)

For the spiced

1 tsp each of cinnamon, all-spice and nutmeg

Method

Beat together the sugar and butter in a large bowl until pale and fluffy. Stir in half the flour until combined then add the remaining flour and use your hands to bring it together. Add your chosen fillings and use your hands to bring the dough into a rough ball.

Roll the dough into a fat sausage, roughly 5cm/2in in diameter. Wrap tightly in cling film and refrigerate for at least 1 hour or until solid. (You can freeze the rolls for as long as you like and slice off the cookies and bake as required.)

Preheat the oven to 200C/180C Fan/Gas 6 and line a baking tray with baking paper. Unwrap the cling film and slice the sausage into 14 rounds, roughly 2cm wide. Place onto the lined tray and cook for 15–20 minutes or until the edges are beginning to brown but the tops have no colour.

Leave to cool slightly and enjoy. These will keep well for at least a week in a sealed container, but the fresher they are the better.

Averil's Glorious Brandy Sauce

This is the best ever brandy sauce! Disclosure: it includes alcohol (of course) and raw eggs so won't suit everyone. But it is quite divine and freezes perfectly into delicious ice cream!

3 egg yolks (make meringues with the whites) 284 ml/10 fl oz double cream

45 ml/3 tbsp golden syrup


30 ml/2 tbsp brandy (or a touch more!)

Whip the yolks until creamy. Whip the cream until it holds its shape. Warm the syrup in the microwave or in a small pot on the hob.

Then bring the four ingredients together, very gently, in a large bowl. Cover and chill overnight and remove from the fridge 30 minutes before you serve your pudding. Heaven!

Teme Valley Wildlife

December brings the close of the year and affords an opportunity to review the preceding eleven months. 2025 has been unique for me, because it is the first year during which I have been obliged to share my garden with a muntjac deer.

"Mitzi" first hove into view in January, on the front lawn, investigating the grass under the bird feeder and inspecting the herbaceous borders. In broad daylight, she showed little fear of humans, but on that day appeared troubled by biting insects, possibly ticks. She repeatedly turned round to chew the fur on her back and abruptly hopped about in tight circles, as though trying to dislodge something. She's returned nearly every day since, entering from the lane, travelling up a secluded gully between our hedge and that of our next-door neighbour, crossing the border, lawn and drive then trotting up a bank and on into the orchard.

As spring brought life to the garden, Mitzi's presence proved to be rather less than benign. A prized patch of snake's head fritillaries in a damp

part of the lawn suddenly appeared shortened. The flower stems had been bitten off a few inches above the ground and a deer-slot next to this work informed me of the culprit. Any stem rising from the ground bearing a tasty bud proved to be too much

of a temptation for Mitzi. After I had swathed my fritillaries in sticks wound with black cotton she turned her attention to my cowslips, aquilegias and scabious instead. My husband was appalled to find a large Schubertii allium bud detached from its stem and lying on the ground – too garlicky to eat we assumed. She then explored the patio and demolished a pot of his lilies.

A grassy bank where I had envisaged a drift of large purple crocus in William Robinson's "wild garden" style proved a total disappointment. Here, Mitzi waited for the buds to open before eating them, mercifully leaving the leaves behind, which I hope means that the plants might survive. Gravetye, Robinson's wonderful garden in Sussex,

is fully deer-fenced, I now learn. Perhaps I should have checked on that before embarking on one of his planting schemes.

Cross, but resigned to life with Mitzi, I shrugged my shoulders at her summer activities as she pruned the roses before they had flowered, leaving me to wait for colour later in the year. She, meanwhile, enjoyed fallen cherries, raspberries – both leaves and fruit – then damsons. Apples and pears aren't to her taste.

Autumn shed light on her night-time exploits. Opening a window to let out a wasp one evening, I heard cough-like barks coming from the orchard. This had to be Mitzi summoning a mate. And who did I see a few mornings later, travelling her route beside the hedge? Yes, a large male with gnarly swept-back horns. Oh, just my luck, "Marmaduke" has moved in as well!
