Dear Readers

If you live in Teme Valley South, or simply go to church in the parish, as I do, the centre of the worshipping community is the cathedral in Worcester. We've always been a bit out on a limb, the furthest west in a diocese which stretches from Redditch to Rochford, and from Dudley to Upton-on-Severn.

Tucked away in the valley we are small communities centred around small churches, which suits us. Just occasionally some of us attend services or celebrations at the cathedral for special events. As visitors we marvel at the lofty architecture and the history it has witnessed; we find space for reflection in a place of prayer. We are uplifted by the grandeur of ceremony, the beauty of words and music. Some of us have other connections through school or university, art or performance.

On a warm, sunny evening in mid-May a service was held at the cathedral which, possibly for the first time, celebrated smaller churches. It brought together folk who perhaps don't usually stray too far from their home patch but have much in common and share so much that is precious.

As sometimes happens in the cathedral, there was an unexpected sense of intimacy. The wow factor came from the music. Choirs from small churches had been invited to come together to sing for the occasion. Music had been distributed electronically for preparation. An hour's rehearsal with a fine director and a magnificent organist and we were ready to go. Fifty voices raised in song. Three beautifully chosen anthems, fine hymns and a beautiful blessing lifted the spirits of singers and congregation alike in glorious praise and gentle exhortation.

The whole experience was a reminder that we are indeed part of a wider world, and that together we share in the sublime.





As an encore and after some coaching of the audience by Charlotte Forrest, we all joined in the chorus of Funiculì, Finiculà – "Jamme, jamme 'ncoppa, jamme jà" ("Let's go! Let's go! To the top *we'll go!"*) and left the theatre with our heads and hearts full of music.

Very many thanks to everyone who made this splendid concert possible: the four superb soloists, their incomparable accompanist Charlotte Forrest, and the Neen Sollars and Milson Community Choir who rose magnificently to the challenge of forming an opera chorus and rehearsed tirelessly for months with their wonderful music director Anita Clements. We hope to see you all again!

Some thoughts about the beautiful game ...

I missed the Cup Final last week so I'm not sure if they sang "Abide with me" before kick off, as they always used to do. I think that particular hymn must have been chosen because until sometime in the 1950s everybody knew the words and the tune.

Nevertheless it got me thinking about how closely the beautiful game is linked to Church and Chapel.

Aston Villa was founded in 1874 by members of a Wesleyan chapel in Handsworth. Until recently they did not play fixtures on Good Friday. Wolves was founded from St Luke's school at about the same time.

In Scotland, St Johnstone play in St John's town (Perth) and St Mirren play in Paisley and are named after the patron saint of Paisley Abbey, St Mirin.

Also in Scotland, Queens Park FC are an interesting lot. Founded in 1867 they claim to be the 10th oldest football club in the world and were formed from a local YMCA club in Glasgow. For many years they owned and played in the Hampden Park Stadium, which is huge, but as they remained wholly amateur until 2019 their crowds grew smaller and smaller, as did their results, so they moved to another place and started paying their players. They are the only Scottish team to have played in two FA Cup Finals in England – but they lost both times, in 1884 and 1885. The club's amateur status was reflected in its Latin motto *Ludere causa ludendi* – to play for the sake of playing.

Marry Me Chicken

I can promise you that this is the most delicious chicken recipe you will ever find! The name is a reference to the dish's supposed ability to capture someone's heart. Serves 4

Ingredients

30g plain flour 4 chicken breasts 125g sundried tomatoes in oil, drained and roughly chopped, 3 tbsp oil reserved 1 red onion finely chopped 3 garlic cloves crushed or finely grated ½ - 1 tsp chilli flakes (to taste) 2-3 thyme or oregano sprigs, leaves picked, or 1 tsp mixed dried herbs 150ml double cream 250ml chicken stock 35g parmesan grated 8-10 basil leaves torn, to serve juice of one lemon, to serve

Method

Put the flour on a plate and season with salt and freshly ground black pepper. Coat the chicken in the flour.

Heat 2 tbsp of the sundried tomato oil in a large, lidded frying pan over a medium heat and fry the



chicken for 8-10 mins until golden all over, but not cooked through. Set the chicken aside on a plate.

Drizzle the remaining 1 tbsp sundried tomato oil into the pan and reduce the heat to medium-low. Fry the onion for 8-10 mins until softened but not golden. Stir in the garlic and cook for another minute before adding the sundried tomatoes, chilli and thyme or oregano, stirring well.

Add the chicken back to the pan, pour over the cream and chicken stock and season well. Put the lid on the pan and cook on medium-low for about 20 mins, turning the chicken halfway through until it is cooked through and the sauce has thickened a little. Stir in the parmesan, then serve with a scattering of basil leaves and lemon juice squeezed over.

Teme Valley Wildlife

Some thoughts on swans. Are they native to Britain? Does the Crown own them all? Can their wings break a man's arm? It's "no" to all three, but let's start with the different types of swan currently living in Britain. The most common is the all-yearresident mute swan, the other two, the whooper and



both parents look after the youngsters. The silvery-grey cygnets hitch lifts on their parents' backs and hang on with their bills when mum or dad upends to dibble for food under water. Towards the end of the year, as the cygnets turn white, their parents encourage them to leave and set up their own territo-

Bewick's swans, are seasonal visitors flying in from northern Europe or Russia to take advantage of less harsh winter weather. The whooper is named for having a trumpet-like call while Bewick's swan is named after the eighteenth-century illustrator Thomas Bewick (1753-1828). The latter two species have black and yellow bills, while the mute swan's is bright orange. The whooper is of similar size to the mute, the Bewick considerably smaller.

Male and female swans are known as cobs and pens. The male mute swan has a prominent black knob at the base of his bill. Mute swans can be seen on rivers, canals and ponds, especially where there is sufficient vegetation to conceal a nest. Eggs are laid between March and May and ries.

It was the highly territorial nature of a cob I saw in the spring on Spetchley Park lake (pictured above) which gave me the idea for this article. The lake has a small island where a vigorous cob was driving all comers away from where his mate had built her nest. With wings held rigidly curved above his back, he achieved a surprising turn of speed using only webbed-foot propulsion. Without flapping his wings or rising out of the water, he motored down on ducks and geese alike, all of whom scattered out of his path.

Despite such aggressive behaviour, swans have an elegant and beautiful courtship dance which I once had the privilege to witness. Whilst

walking along a riverbank early one morning, I saw two swans performing a ritual more balletic than *Swan Lake* itself. Moving silently towards one another, the birds' elegantly arched necks formed a perfect heart-shape. They turned and glided away, circling back to repeat the process, they then rose up out of the water facing one another on paddling feet, both in total synchrony. I held my breath and watched entranced.

And what of swans' royal associations? They are said to have been brought from Cyprus by Richard the Lionheart. For centuries the Crown controlled their ownership through royal swanherds and courts called swanmotes, but eventually others owned them too and marked their beaks to stake a claim. This is the origin of "swan-upping" ceremonies which are still held today on a few rivers. The next meeting of the Teme Valley Wildlife Group will be at 7.30pm on Thursday 12th June at Stoke Bliss and Kyre Village Hall. We welcome Peter Bower whose talk is called "Breathing life into bogs: restoring mosses for nature, climate and communities". Members and friends are all welcome, it's just £3 on the door.


