Days out in south Herefordshire

Ed Yarnold continues the story of his days out in the south of the county

The church I wanted to visit was St Peter's in Peterchurch, in the Golden Valley on the Hereford to Hay-on-Wye Road.



It is a big church with a strong village hub. My main reason for visiting was to see the burial place of a soldier who had been involved in the defence of Rorke's Drift against the Zulus in South Africa. The film starring Michael Caine and Stanley Baker seems to be on the television every Christmas!

He was born in Monmouthshire and worked as a farm labourer until he joined up at the age of 14 in 1876 and took part in the battle in 1879. He and ten others were awarded the Victoria Cross, the most ever awarded in one battle.

He continued his service in India before transferring to the Army Reserves. On his return home he settled in Peterchurch, marrying a local girl and fathering five children. In the summer of 1898 he complained of headaches and in September of that year he was found dead with his gun beside him.

At the inquest the verdict was given as suicide and as the church was against suicide he was not allowed a proper funeral in the church – his coffin had to be lifted over the wall and his tombstone faces in the opposite direction to all the others in the graveyard. His grave is well cared for by the Welsh Regiment and his descendants, who still live locally and continue to campaign for him to have a proper funeral. His VC remains in the hands of Michael Ashcroft, a wealthy industrialist.

The museum of The Welsh Regiment in Brecon has more information regarding the Zulu wars.



Guardians of Hollow Meadow - our first year

We have been very busy in the year since we registered Guardians of Hollow Meadow CIC (Community Interest Company limited by guarantee). Hollow Meadow is now owned by the CIC which secures its future. It is also a local wildlife site. If the group disbands, the Charities Commission regulator is responsible for ensuring that it goes to a suitable similar enterprise and is not allowed to be sold on the open market.

Natural Networks, Severn Rivers Trust and Coronation Orchards have supported us and funded the following projects.

Coronation Orchards supplied nine fruit trees from Frank Matthews. Wade Muggleton from the Countryside Commission and our group helped plant them in February. The selection was made to spread the flowering and cropping season, so with these trees and the ones around the village hall the whole parish should be able to drink local apple juice all year! As well as apples there are pears, cherries and a plum, Marjorie's Seedling (in memory of Marjorie and Fred Janes who were the first to welcome me to Stoke Bliss in 1984). They join a medlar planted in 2022 and bearing fruit this year.

Realigning the fencing to be below the footpath was the next task, with footpath gates courtesy of Worcestershire County Council Footpaths department. Thanks to the stalwart 'volunteers' who removed the section of old fencing.

Cutting the figure of eight footpath around the

meadow, pruning hazel, dogwood and willow (plus bramble and thistles) was also done with the help of volunteers. A regular task, so save money on the gym and have your workout on Hollow Meadow instead.

Meadow hay was cut and baled and some taken to seed other sites in Teme Valley South. The Tai Chi group of instructors experienced the meadow on a lovely summer's day.

On Monday 20th September there was a mass invasion of grant makers, tree surgeon, digger and driver and a newt specialist. Soup and cakes encouraged all to work hard on the shallow scrape on the left of the field, in the meadowsweet border. Once the ash tree had its low hanging limbs trimmed and assessed for ash dieback, all decamped to the east end of the field.

Then it was time to create a swale and an alleviation pool. A long-disused badger tunnel didn't help but we were eventually successful. Now it is only the hedgerow planting to be done in November – see you there?

We have also dealt with risk assessments, land transfer, had a business masterclass, become part of Malvern Hills Nature Therapy group etc etc. The general consensus is that GOHM CIC has certainly put its roots down – and plenty of cake always helps!

Remember, remember ...

"Remember, remember, the fifth of November Gunpowder treason and plot ...

Our grandchildren, born and brought up in America, know nothing of Guy Fawkes. They love Hallowe'en, dressing up in outlandish costumes, trick-or-treating around the neighbourhood and coming home with bucketsful of candy, but Bonfire Night? Guy who?

Guy Fawkes Day commemorates the failure of the Gunpowder Plot of 1605, when a group of conspirators made a dastardly plan to blow up the Houses of Parliament during the state opening, meaning to blow King James I and all the members of Parliament to smithereens.

The conspirators, led by Robert Catesby, were Roman Catholics and under James I England was a protestant country. Catesby and his friends, including Guido (Guy) Fawkes, were angry at the king for refusing to grant greater religious tolerances for Catholics.

The plotters stored 36 barrels of gunpowder in the cellars of the Houses of Parliament, but the plot failed – the king's guards caught Guy Fawkes red handed in the cellar with the gunpowder on the evening before the planned attack. He was arrested, tried, convicted, hanged, drawn and quartered – not a nice way

to go. The other traitors all suffered the same fate, except the ones who were shot while trying to run away.

Parliament declared 5th November a national day of thanksgiving. The first celebration was held in 1606.

Guy Fawkes Day, or Bonfire Night, is celebrated on 5th November every year

in the UK with bonfires and fireworks. Effigies of Guy Fawkes are burnt on the bonfires. Fireworks and sparklers, representing the explosives that were never used by the plotters, are a big part of the celebrations.

And even today guards search the Houses of Parliament and its cellars on 5th November to check for arsonists, although this is now more ceremonial than serious.

We see no reason why gunpowder treason Should ever be forgot ..."

Roof and ceiling repair project at St Peter's Stoke Bliss

What we have done so far

- In 2022 we applied for a grant from the Handley Trust and were awarded £4,700 which enabled us to carry out much-needed repairs to some of the leaded windows on the north and south sides of the church.
- We have been successful in our applications for funding to Dieterich Preservation Trust, Lassiter and Worcester diocese and can now carry out the repairs to the buttress on the north west corner of the church.
- We have appointed a new architect, John Middleton. In October he began the process of drawing up tendering specifications for repairs to roof and ceiling. Once the tendering process is complete we will have some more precise figures to work from and can begin applying for grants.

What next?

Grant funders will expect us to raise some of the money towards the major repair work to the roof and ceiling and to evidence that we are in support of the church.

In 2022, as a result of Covid, we were very fortunate in being granted funding for the repairs to window tracery in the Lady Chapel at St Mary's, Kyre, by Heritage England. We raised additional funds through the sale of Maggie Kingston's

books and individual donations.

Our churches at St Mary's, Kyre and St Peter's, Stoke Bliss need regular donations to support the day to day running costs of the church – electricity, insurance and general maintenance. We do this currently through the joint coffee mornings and other events shared with the village hall

New local business sponsors Tenbury Under 11s





Teme Valley Wildlife



In this month's photograph a field sown with sunflowers and other seed-producing plants is seen against the splendid backdrop of the Clee Hills. After writing earlier in the year about the seed mixes farmers use to support pollinating insects, I hadn't expected to be following it with a few words about plants grown for birds. However, the use of "cover crops", "herbal leys" and "green manures" by farmers and gardeners alike is becoming more common.

The idea behind such crops is to employ natural methods to improve the fertility and structure of the soil. By ploughing plants back in at the end of the season, soil humus levels can be usefully increased. In addition deep-rooted plants can help to loosen compacted ground and nitrogen-fixing plants can help restore nutrient levels. It is hoped that less artificial fertiliser will be needed to grow a subse-

quent cereal crop. That birds, insects and small mammals get a boost from cover crops is a secondary but very welcome benefit.

Sunflowers are always lovely to see and were very successful when the Teme Valley Wildlife Group grew a bird seed mix in a field at Eastham some years ago. The sunflower gets its name from the fact that its flower heads turn to face the sun and gradually move by the hour as the sun travels

01886 812302 07951 464408 across the sky. Its Latin name of Helianthus annulus, literally annual sunflower, reflects this. Although it is probably the largest flower in Britain to exhibit this behaviour, it is by no means the only one. Bright red field poppies do the same.

Some flowers open when the sun is shining and close when it goes in. The tiny flower of the scarlet pimpernel opens at about 8 o'clock in the morning and closes at 2 o'clock in the afternoon, earlier if it is dull, and has acquired the name "poor man's weather-glass" because of this. Similar behaviour is exhibited by goat's beard, a tall dandelion-headed flower which opens in the morning but has shut by noon. This plant also goes by the name of "Jack-go-to-bed-at-noon". Quite why these plants act as they do, I'm not really sure. Some flowers need to protect their pollen against rain and shut up in damp conditions, wood anemones do this, but why flowers shut up for the afternoon I do not know.

Another fascinating fact is that some types of water lily sink their buds under water over night which then rise up at daybreak to open, before closing and sinking again in the evening. The Nile lily was observed to do this by the ancients who saw it as a symbol of resurrection, dying every evening and being reborn every morning in the eternal cycle of death and resurrection. Who would have thought that plants could tell us so much?

The next meeting of the Teme Valley Wildlife Group will be at 7.30pm on Thursday 14th November at Stoke Bliss and Kyre village hall. We welcome Jo from Haven4Wildlife whose talk is called "Gardening with wildlife in mind". Members and friends are all welcome, it is just £3 on the door. This will be our last meeting for 2024.
