

Dear Readers

As many of you know, I will soon be stepping away from ministry for a three month sabbatical, from this month to the end of November. It's a time for rest, reflection and renewal – a pause not from faith or calling but from the daily responsibilities of parish life. While I'll certainly miss worshipping and ministering in these parishes, I know that this season of stepping back is part of the rhythm of healthy ministry.

Interestingly, there's a parallel just down the M5 at one of the most unlikely places, Glastonbury Festival. Every few years, the famous music festival takes a break – a "fallow year". No stages, no soundchecks, no muddy fields filled with dancing crowds. Instead, the land rests. So do the farmers, the organisers and even the local community. After all the energy poured into the event, the fallow year gives time to recover and prepare for what's to come.

It's a deeply biblical idea too. In the Old Testament, God commands the land to be left fallow every seventh year (Leviticus 25). It's not just agricultural wisdom – it's spiritual wisdom. Rest isn't a luxury, it's a necessity. Sabbath is woven into the very fabric of creation. Even Jesus, in the middle of his ministry, withdrew to quiet places to pray and be refreshed.

So as I enter this time of sabbatical, I invite you to reflect too. What does "rest" look like in our own lives and that of our churches? What might be learnt from stepping back for a season – from the busyness, the noise, the pressure to produce? How can we enable fresh energy to be released from this place of rest?

This isn't just about taking a holiday; it's about trusting that God is still at work even when we aren't. That seeds planted in faith continue to grow even when we don't see them. And that our value isn't defined by constant activity, but by being beloved children of God.

1985 – a year to remember

Do you remember 1985? It was the year the Boss and I moved to Stoke Bliss from Hertfordshire. Margaret Thatcher was the prime minister, the year-long miners' strike ended and chart-topping hits included *Take on Me* by A-ha and *Careless Whisper* by George Michael. Dire Straits' *Brothers in Arms* was the first album to sell over 1 million copies in the new CD format.

The wreck of the Titanic was discovered. The iconic Live Aid concerts were held at Wembley Stadium and in Philadelphia. *Back to the Future* became a hit in the UK and the 14th James Bond film, *A View to a Kill*, was released – the seventh and final appearance by Roger Moore as 007.

In sport, Boris Becker became the youngest Wimbledon men's champion aged just 17 and Dennis Taylor beat Steve Davis in the World Snooker Championship.

The BBC launched *EastEnders* and *Blind Date* first appeared on ITV. Children's BBC was launched with Philip Schofield in the broom cupboard.

Notable people born in 1985 include Wayne Rooney, Lewis Hamilton, Keira Knightly and Beth Tweddle. Rock Hudson, Philip Larkin and Ray Ellington died. There were some famous, and short-lived, marriages. Madonna married Sean Penn. They divorced in 1989. Joan Collins married her fourth husband, Peter Holm. They divorced in

1987. And Sylvester Stallone married Bridgette Nielson. They also divorced in 1987.

Influenced by shows such as *Dallas* and *Dynasty*, power dressing became all the rage with oversized sharp-shouldered jackets. There was lots of big hair.

In 1985 you could buy a loaf of bread for 48p, a pint of milk for 23p and a dozen eggs for 84p. Petrol was 42p a litre and a pint of bitter cost 83p. The average house price was £29,143 and the average annual salary was £9,924.

And in September 1985 Teme Valley South News began life as a folded foolscap sheet run off from a stencil on the aging Gestetner machine in the parish room at the Rectory. I became editor a couple of years later and we turned it into a black and white A5 magazine produced by an electronic stencil cutter in the Resource Centre in Bromyard. In September 2016 it was already 31 years old when it became TemeTalk and burst into colour, printed by Orphans Press in Leominster. We produce 11 issues each year – so far we have produced 423 issues including two during Covid which were online only.

So happy 40th anniversary to TemeTalk and thank you to all our contributors, readers and advertisers for your support which has allowed us to reach this great age!





Teme Valley Wildlife

The Ledwyche brook is a Shropshire tributary of the River Teme which joins the river at Burford next to the gardens of Burford House. It begins in the foothills of Brown Clee, west of Stoke St Milborough, and for five of its 17-mile length traces the border between Herefordshire and Shropshire. It is crossed by a formal footbridge in the grounds of Henley Hall, by a Grade Illisted bridge on Squirrel

Lane between Ludlow and Bitterley and by the Elan Valley water pipeline near Caynham Camp and hosts a flood-warning river-level station at Burford Bridge on the A456.

What is notable about the Ledwyche brook is that it is home to a plant rarely seen in the wild. Well-known as a garden plant, Monkshood is a stately plant with striking blue flowers which form the shape of a monk's cowl. It originates in Europe and Asia where it has long been known to be extremely poisonous. All parts of the plant can do harm, but the root, shaped like a turnip, is the most dangerous. The Latin name of Aconitum



napellus refers to "little turnip", the meaning of the word "napellus". It appears to be very happy growing along the Ledwyche brook.

I unexpectedly came upon some specimens back in June whilst following Little Hereford's Millennium Walk. It favours shady stream sides and was growing on both the Herefordshire and Shropshire sides of the brook, sheltered by the trees which line it. I was

struck by the pure blue flowers and the beauty of the tall stems. Botanists have puzzled over whether such plants are native, naturalised or just garden forms escaped into the wild. However, the Ledwyche brook plants are believed to be true natives. The first record in this location was in 1755 by Rev'd E Williams who noted it to be in abundance a few yards above Gossart bridge between Ludlow and Burford. It was next recorded in 1855, "for a mile or so" between Ludlow and Caynham Camp by another botanic reverend, Edward

Whitehead, a Fellow of Corpus Christi College, Oxford.

One of the lovely things about writing these articles is that people sometimes get in touch to share local knowledge. A few years ago, a lady brought up in the valley in the 1940s sent me her father's botany textbook. He noted local plants of interest in the margins. For 23rd May 1946, of Monkshood he wrote, "at quantity at weir near Sheet, Ludlow", so here was a twentieth century Ledwyche brook record. Researching a little further, I found it had also been spotted on the Cadmore brook in Worcestershire, along the Teme at Rochford and many years ag, at Eastham on Eastham Hill, although I think it more likely to have been on Piper's Brook, not on the hill itself. I wonder what these small, localised tributaries of the Teme have in common to attract wild Monkshood?

Another name for it is Wolfsbane, a name thought to recall a practice of leaving meat laced with monkshood poison in traps to lure and kill wolves. It is also thought that a compound made from it was used to tip hunters' arrows. In ancient Rome a ban was placed on its cultivation – I wonder why? Today it is used in Chinese medicine and in homeopathy, but I wouldn't want to try it!

The next meeting of the Teme Valley Wildlife Group will be at 7.30pm on Thursday 11th September at Stoke Bliss and Kyre village hall. We welcome Johnny Birks once again, whose talk is called "Restoring balance: the pine marten reintroduction programme in Devon's woodlands". Members and friends are all welcome, it is just £3 on the door.


